- Global sales reach \$14billion
- 2/3 of all Americans support legalization (*Pew Trust 11/2019*)
- Demand remained strong where there was legal access

What We Learned

- INFORMATION:
 - Consumers want better information and will spend more for quality
 - Need more product safety assurance
 - False or unclear label claims
 - Unregulated CBD & THC products with high contaminants or low concentrations
- REGULATION:
 - Don't look to FDA anytime soon for clear regulations
- INFRASTRUCTURE:
 - Supply Chain tracking from Seed to Sale - Critical to growth

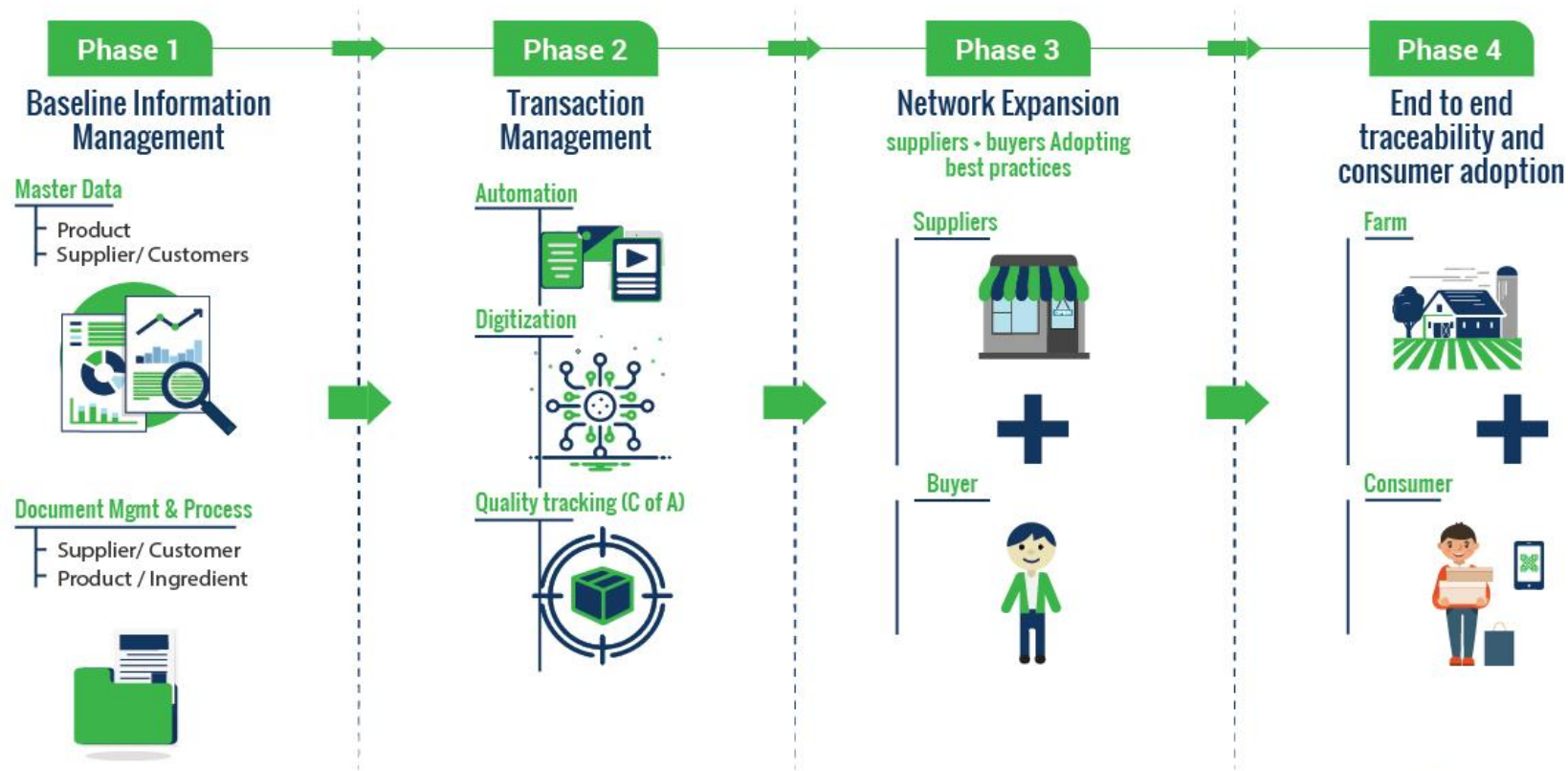
TRACEABILITY REPORTING OF THE BLOCKCHAIN
